

## F301: FILMS OF THE GREAT WAR

World War I arguably set the stage for the remainder of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Its tumultuous impact on our present world even in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century is significant.

This course is one of a number of OLLI courses covering the centennial of the Great War. War has always attracted serious filmmakers, and World War I is no exception. We will do an historical examination of representative aspects of that war as seen through the medium of film. The class goal is to understand how films produced about the war reflected contemporary reality or perceived reality of the war. Ranging from classics such as *All Quiet on the Western Front* and *Paths of Glory* to more recent productions such as *Regeneration* and *Capitaine Conan*, the films have been chosen for their artistic merit, historical accuracy, and realism.

The theme of significant World War I films has remained overwhelmingly focused on the utter futility and anti-heroic nature of that war for the better part of a century. And indeed the disparate films in this course are linked by their portrayal of World War I in that light. *All Quiet on the Western Front* goes from idealism to futility and disillusionment; *Paths of Glory* looks at ruthlessness, stupidity and opportunism; *Joyeux Noel* offers a ray of humanity; *Regeneration* provides a glimpse at post traumatic stress syndrome; and *Capitaine Conan* explores the brutality and rigidity of war. All take the perspective of looking up from the trenches rather than looking down from the heights of power and authority.

Time constraints and film length limit us to five films. A few class sessions will run 5 to 15 minutes over schedule and there will be some split sessions. There will be historical background commentary and class discussion of the films and the Great War, also dubbed afterwards as the “War to End All Wars”.
