- An incredible set of resources and opportunities for anyone to be involved in "international" activities, many at no cost




Multilateral Institutions

- > The International Monetary Fund and the World Bank
 - The IMF was established to maintain order in the international monetary system
 - To help stabilize exchange rates
 - To be a lender of last resort for countries that get into financial difficulties
 - The World Bank was established for rebuilding Europe after the 2nd World War and to help promote economic development
 - Its focus changed to developing countries in the 1950s as the U.S. started to provide assistance to European countries directly
 - Organization of American States (OAS)





- In response to the need for post-war reconstruction of Europe and to discuss the future of international economic cooperation...
- Representatives from 44 countries met at Bretton Woods, New Hampshire in July 1944
- Created three institutions:
 - 1.International Monetary Fund (IMF)
 - 2.International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD), a.k.a. the "World Bank"
 - 3. General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT), now the World Trade Organization (WTO)



Operation of the IMF A field of the set of the s



Organization of American States


- An inter-continental organization of 35 states in the Americas, including Canada and the U.S., founded on April 30, 1948 – to encourage regional stability and cooperation.
- The OAS brings together all 35 states and constitutes the main political, juridical, and social governmental forum in the Hemisphere.
- OAS has granted permanent observer status to 69 other states and the EU.




Pan American Union Building

Embassies

- > 177 embassies in Washington, D.C.
 - Other diplomatic facilities, consular offices, trade missions, etc., located within and outside D.C.
 - Plus Delegation of the European Union to the United States
 - List of embassies: <u>www.embassy.org</u>
- > Embassy Row Massachusetts Avenue, Dupont Circle, etc.
- > Embassy events contribute to Washington's social and cultural life. There are dinners and receptions with exclusive guest lists, often in the privacy of ambassadors' residences.
- > National days are occasions for wonderful celebrations, e.g.
 - France's Bastille Day (July 14, 2016)
 - Ireland's St. Patrick's Day (March 17, 2016)
 - Germany's Day of German Unity (October 3, 2016)
 - India's Independence Day (August 15, 2016)











Think Tanks

- Organizations involved in public-policy research analysis and engagement that generate policy-oriented research, analysis, and advice on domestic and international issues – to assist policymakers and the public to make informed decisions about public policy
- Think-tank categories: Autonomous, quasi independent, government affiliated, quasi governmental, university affiliated, political party affiliated, corporate (for profit)
- Of the 6,846 think tanks worldwide, 1,835 are in the U.S., 435 in China, 288 in U.K., 280 in India,...
 - Of the 1,835 U.S.-based think tanks, almost 400 are in the Washington D.C. region
- ➤ The Top 10 think tanks in the U.S. are all based in Washington D.C.

> Two Key Departments (from an international perspective)

U.S. Department of State

- Created in 1789, the State Department was the first executive department of U.S. Government responsible for international relations, equivalent to other countries' foreign ministry.
- Role: Protecting and assisting U.S. citizens living or traveling abroad; Assisting U.S. businesses in the international marketplace; Coordinating and providing support for international activities of other U.S. agencies (local, state, or federal government), official visits overseas and at home, and other diplomatic efforts....
- U.S. Department of Commerce
 - The Department works with businesses, universities, communities, and the Nation's workers to promote job creation, economic growth, sustainable development, and improved standards of living for Americans.
 - 12 bureaus and nearly 47,000 employees located in all 50 states and territories and more than 86 countries worldwide
