



Science and Technology




- Less than 15% of U.S. students have the prerequisites even to pursue scientific or technical degrees
- The number of students pursuing an engineering degree has declined by one-third
- 88% of high school dropouts had passing grades, but dropped out due to boredom
- Up to 20% of high school dropouts test in the gifted range

Gifted and Talented Youth

- U.S. 4th grade students score above the international average in math and science.
- In 8th grade they score below average in math and only slightly above in science
- By 12th students are near the bottom of a 49 country survey



Special Education

- Nationally 12.3% of children ages 5-17 have a disability that makes it difficult to perform everyday activities.
- The number of disabled children is increasing
- Children with disabilities are more likely than other children to be sad, unhappy, or depressed (31% for disabled children, 17% for other children)
- Learning disabilities, including speech and language disorders and academic disorders, can affect a child's education, future employment, family life, and daily functioning.
