
## Do we react?

- Put aside "realness" and process normally, unless too extreme?























# Quasi-Experimental Intervention

wo Ages: 9 year olds/ 14 year olds

wo Schools: Low SES/ High SES

Comparison Groups: Music/Art


Control: Age, SES, Sex, Verbal IQ, Experience, Characteristics

Outcomes: Theory of Mind, Empathy, Emotion Regulation
