

Archive of LRI Courses

Thanks to Allen Montecino, we no longer have to search through old catalogs to locate the names of instructors or

courses offered in past semesters. Here's how to find them:

- 1. Go to www.gmu.edu/departments/lri/history.htm
- 2. Select the year you think the course ran. Example: for a course in 1999, select "prog099.htm" from the list. That will give you all courses and special events in Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall 1999.
- 3. Select "Edit" from the top task list, then "Find in page."
- 4. Type in the name of the instructor (last name, first name or both) or a word or two that you think were in the course title or description.

The program will then scan the course files for the year you picked and stop each time it comes to the words you entered. Hit "Find next" after each stop to get further entries. Each entry will show you the course description as it appeared in the catalog. If you don't find anything in the year you picked, try another year.

You can also use the system to locate special events, using any clue words, such as the name of a speaker, a topic, a place visited or a coordinator.




