- The LRI annual budget currently is slightly over \$176,000, and we will soon be developing the budget for 2003. LRI is in reasonably good financial health, but we need to look carefully, as always, at income versus current expenditures and longer-term equipment requirements plus an operating reserve.

Important bond referendum

George Mason University is asking LRI for help in educating our friends and neighbors on the General Obligation Bond Referendum that will be on the November ballot.

The referendum provides \$900 million in financing for a wide range of projects for Virginia's colleges and universities. GMU is designated to receive \$80 million for construction on its campuses in Fairfax, Arlington and Prince William counties. The university says this construction is vital to meeting the expanding student population in Northern Virginia. This education bond is NOT a tax selections in numerical order as referendum and is NOT connected with the more controversial transportation funding issue to be decided on the same ballot.

Flyers describing the bond issue are in our LRI classrooms. Additional information is on the web site www.supportgmu.org. Please educate yourself and your friends on this issue and please help get out the vote on November 5.

LRI receives laptops

LRI now has three "new" laptop computers, thanks to LRI member Bill Ciccolo and his former employer, the SRA Corp. These used computers no longer met the company's needs, but they are needed at LRI to present instructional material in classrooms and to serve as backup computers in the office.

LRI got excellent technical support from Richards Computer in Merrifield in reprogramming these machines for our needs.

This success story started with the initiative of a member (Bill) in convincing his former employer (SRA) to make a contribution to IRI followed by a local

Toshiba maintenance office (Richards Computer) providing LRI with timely and low-cost software support to make the computers usable for LRI. We need more of this kind of initiative by members and cooperation by local businesses.

To get the classes you want... PRIORITIZE!

The most important thing you can do to improve your chances of getting the courses you want is to list them in order of their importance to you on the Registration

Some members are listing their they appear in the catalog. Wrong! The computer registration system puts all selections in the order they are listed on the form. If you want to get into an especially popular course but list it as, say, your third or fourth

choice, chances are you won't get into that one. List it first and you are almost certain to get in. In the fall term, everyone got their first choice, and most got their second choice.

You can increase your chances of getting the courses you want if you get the Registration Form in early. The computer tracks the dates that forms are received, and early birds have a better crack at getting courses they want.

Catalogs are mailed on Fridays (dates are announced in LRI publications), and registration begins the following Thursday to allow for mail delivery. You can see a copy sooner if you come by the Tallwood office that week, though Registration Forms cannot be accepted until the official beginning of registration on Thursday. You can also read the catalog on our home page (www.gmu.edu/departments/lri).

Treasurer's Corner

LRI is in good financial health at this time, thanks to the efforts of Allen Montecino, who preceded me as treasurer, the efforts of the operating committees and members who save LRI money by volunteering their time and talents, as well as giving to "Friends of LRI" and other development/ fund-raising activities.

LRI operates on a calendar year. The Finance Committee began its budget planning for 2003 in September. Members of the committee are Janet Meisenhelder, Charles Duggan (a CPA), Allen Montecino, LRI administrator Joanne Lingerfelt, and yours truly (also a CPA and chairman of the committee). All committee chairpersons have been asked to use a "clean sheet of paper" in crafting their budget requests—that is, use a zero-based budgeting approach in requesting funds necessary to meet the organization's goals and members' needs. The Finance Committee will review the requests and prepare a preliminary 2003 budget for the Board's consideration at its November meeting. If the Board requests additional time to consider the budget, we will defer a decision until the December meeting. In any event, we plan to have a budget in place by Janu-

Whether or not the approved 2003 budget will necessitate a dues increase next year is impossible to predict at this time. Our goal, however, is to approve a budget that is fiscally responsible to maintain, if not improve, our financial health over time and to maintain the quality of our programs and hopefully build on that success over the next several years as well.

Once next year's budget is finalized and approved, I will report the results to you and will also inform you from time to time on our finances as the year progresses.
