## **George Mason University Schedule**

Because LRI follows George Mason's scheduled closings, a recent University notice is of interest. If a red alert is announced, it says, the University initially will continue to operate as usual. If campus operations are modified, the changes will be "widely announced." Announcement locations will include TV channels 18 in Fairfax County and Reston, and channels 73 and 95 in Alexandria. GMU has a special alert web page at www.gmu.edu/alert. WGMU, the University radio station, will also carry alert status messages. However, the station switched to FM 88.1 last month, and the signal does not carry beyond the campus.
