New Bus Pickup Location

The pickup and drop-off location for LRI bus trips has changed. Starting this term, the new location will be a parking area at Fair Oaks Shopping Center. This location is easy to get to-after you have gone there once. The parking lot is not near the shopping mall itself. It is located outside the circumferential road—Service Road—in the area between the two entrances to the Center from Route 50. Members approaching from the west should use one of these entrances. Cars coming from the east should take the fly-over off the left side of Route 50. A Holiday Inn can be seen some 900 feet to the east of the bus pickup lot, but the lot is not part of the hotel grounds. The LRI office has maps showing the pickup location. If you are a John Heffernanmember, simply set your destination to 38.86461°N 077.35658°W.
