Legislative Hearing

Eileen Duggan and Gordon Canyock put on their speakers' hats in support of GMU and higher education funding at a budget hearing before a group of Virginia lawmakers at the NVCC Woodbridge campus on January 6. GMU had requested LRI's participation along with that of GMU students, faculty, and staff. Eileen and Gordon told members of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees about LRI and about its reliance on GMU for space, faculty speakers, and university resources. GMU is facing a budget shortfall over the next few years and without the \$8.5 million dollars in the governor's proposed budget, GMU faces tuition increases and a cutback in staff and services.

Art in Classrooms

The Facilities Committee invites members to loan for display in Tallwood's classrooms their collected or original artwork. The work, such as prints, paintings, posters, or photographs, should be framed and will be displayed for several months. If the work is original, it should not have been exhibited previously at Tallwood. Signs with the work will identify the owner and provide a
