# Suggestions

Most of the suggestions we receive in the LRI suggestion box concern things that the board, committee chairs and administrative staff can do to improve the LRI experience (classes, facilities, etc.). But here's one suggestion we received which applies to all LRI members, so we want to pass it along.

SUGGESTION: Now that the new semester is here, it might be a good time to remind our members of classroom etiquette.

•Try to arrive on time. If you enter after the class has started, make every attempt to find a seat via the back of the room rather than walk in front of the speaker, and check your name on the attendance sheet after the class is over. • If you wish to comment or ask a question, please remember to raise your hand and wait to be acknowledged by the speaker rather than interrupt the speaker by calling out your question or comment.

•Please respect your classmates by not dominating the class period with your own questions/comments. Let others have a chance, and remember that your classmates came to hear the speaker.

•Please be mindful that it is discourteous to the speaker and distracting to your fellow members if you spend your time in class talking to your neighbor, filing your nails, knitting, dozing off, or doing other such things rather than paying attention.

-In summary, remember that our speakers are giving us the benefit of their experience, knowledge and time. Express your appreciation by showing interest in the presentation and observing classroom etiquette.

The LRI Fiction Writing Club invites all LRI members to take part in a short story contest. The deadline for entries is April 16. The winner will receive a prize of \$50 and publication in *Fairfax Ink*.

Stories should be typed, double-spaced, and no more than 5,000 words in length. There are no restrictions regarding style or subject matter, and LRI members may submit as many stories as they wish. Each story should be accompanied by a \$5 reading fee (which will pay for the prize and a small honorarium to the judge). The contest will be judged blind by a person who is not a member of LRI, so the title of the story should appear on each page of the manuscript, but the author's name should not appear on the manuscript. The author's name, story title, and word count should appear on a detachable cover sheet.
