Publications Committee For All Members

The LRI Publications Committee spends a great deal of time overseeing the publication of regularly issued LRI materials and maintains the LRI Website. The committee recently put together on paper a set of procedural guidance for publications plus a statement of purpose for the publications themselves. Everything must be thoroughly proofread, and a meeting on proofreading was held on March 26 to make sure that all volunteers involved in this effort know how to proofread and how to be consistent. Some of the committee's experienced proofreaders led this workshop.

In addition the group felt that some of the material on our Website is somewhat out of date and they will look at the pages to determine what needs to be updated, devise a way to keep current and take some of the load off our Webmaster.

As an example of committee work, the copy for *This Week at LRI* is e-mailed ten days ahead of publication to committee member Rick Rifkin who puts the articles together and formats the text. Content may come from committee chairs, board officers or other members who have been assigned to write an article. The text is proofread and adjustments are made if necessary; it then goes to staff who may add content, update information and check for errors. The text is then taken to the GMU printshop that prints our publications at cost. Staff pick up the weekly material and distribute it for pickup by members at Monday class sessions.
