Tired of Waiting in Line?

Well, relief is on the way! One of the persistent frustrations and source for complaints at Tallwood has been the limited availability of rest rooms. On certain peak days, up to 200 people may be attending classes at the same time. On those days, the demand for the three available rest rooms can be overwhelming. When classes break, the queue is often very long and trying, especially on a cold winter day.

The Board of Directors is acutely aware of the problem but has not been able to do anything about it. That is, up to now. When the university began work to correct the structural damage at Tallwood House, we asked if they would construct two new rest rooms across from the existing two in the hallway off the patio.

GMU said yes but made it clear that it would have to be at LRI's expense, estimated at \$30,000 to \$40,000. This price includes the cost of heating and air conditioning.

This will put a demand on LRI's resources, but the Board approved it believing that it is in the best interest of the members. LRI is exploring some outside funding sources that may cover the cost of the project, but nothing is certain.

We anticipate that the work will be completed before the beginning of the fall term. Source: Charles Duggan
