### Lilyan Spero OLLI Honorary Director

At its March 18 meeting, the OLLI Board of Directors passed a motion naming Lilyan Spero, founding member and senior president emeritus, Honorary Director for Life with all the rights and privileges of board members except the right to vote.

Lilyan and her late husband, Abe, were among those instrumental in convincing GMU to assist in starting a program in 1991. A few years later, Lilyan and Abe convinced the university to allow the Institute to use the Tallwood Annex. In 1999, Lilvan led the effort to convince Fairfax County to make a \$25,000 grant to acquire the TA-3 modular building. She considers OLLI her "baby" and has made numerous other contributions to the growth and health of that "baby." ### What's That Date?

How do you keep track of what's going on at OLLI when there are so many special events, clubs and social gatherings? What should you do when you need the dates of the next class term?

There are a few easy ways to keep track of the OLLI calendar, both for the immediate future and for several terms ahead. Just keep on hand two printed items. During class terms, the latest issue of the OLLI News will include on the last page the schedule of events for several weeks ahead. You'll find events, club meeting special dates. luncheons or social events and committee meetings listed there. The latest OLLI Catalog always includes future term beginning and ending dates for the upcoming three OLLI class terms. You'll also find these items on the OLLI Website at www.olli.gmu.edu.

Last minute updates are often sent to the entire OLLI membership via email. List your email address on the registration form when you sign up for classes to receive occasional email messages. And be sure to adjust your computer's spam blocker so that OLLI messages are not blocked. ## Where, Oh Where, Did the Spring Catalogs Go?

That was the question asked by many of us who live in Reston, Herndon and elsewhere in the Dulles corridor as our spring catalogs remained undelivered. The catalogs were sent out from the OLLI office on schedule and yet many members living in certain areas of Northern Virginia got their catalogs about two weeks later. This is very upsetting because it delays members registering for classes and makes it difficult for the office staff to complete their records of the roster of spring classes in a timely manner.

I went to the Reston post office with a catalog in hand and asked one of the supervisors just what caused the delay. The answer appears to be that at the nonprofit rate OLLI pays for bulk postage, USPS is not obligated to get the catalogs to us as quickly as we would like to receive them. They can deliver the catalogs within a window of four weeks. Usually catalogs arrive fairly promptly, but obviously the spring catalog did not. We want those catalogs on time!

Despite the late arrival of catalogs and the delay in many member registrations, everyone who registered for the spring term got their first choice of classes. Further, OLLI's bulk mail contractor is being asked to investigate bulk mailing postage categories to see if any change should be made in our bulk mailing permit.

We hope to have the issue resolved by June when the summer catalog will be sent out to OLLI members. If this problem should happen again, and we hope that it won't, you can print the catalog from our Website at www.olli.gmu.edu or call the OLLI office and a replacement catalog will be mailed to you by first class mail.
