A Thank You to George Mason at Teacher Appreciation and Scholarship Awards Ceremony

Though stormy outside, the weather did not cloud the radiant mood inside the

Center for the Arts as the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute celebrated its annual teacher appreciation and student scholarship awards ceremony April 7. OLLI members and instructors gathered with Mason department heads and scholarship award recipients to give thanks to all who contributed to another fine year of academic excellence at OLLI.

"Whenever a society values learning, investing in it at all levels, then that community thrives," said Mason President Angel Cabrera with respect to OLLI's programming for its membership. And thrive, OLLI does. Last year alone, OLLI exceeded programming expectations, with over 450 instructors/speakers for 400 classes over four terms. OLLI Executive Director Jennifer Disano spotlighted the accomplishments of several instructors and programming volunteers. "Good teachers and good courses are the reason why so many people join and stay at OLLI," she said.

In his keynote address, President Cabrera lavished praise on the Friends of OLLI donors for channeling scholarship money to the Mason departments that provided teachers for OLLI classrooms. In all, 23 Mason students were awarded \$16,500 in scholarship monies from Friends of OLLI. "OLLI is not only investing in its own learning, but also so future generations can make their whole potential come true," President Cabrera said. According to longstanding donors Garrett and Janet Cochran, there is no better use of the Friends of OLLI Fund than for scholarships to Mason students. It is a small way of giving back to Mason for sending teachers to OLLI.

Christian Koudelka, chosen by the Volgenau School of Engineering for his work to enhance computer imaging for the treatment and diagnosis of aneurysms, said the OLLI award is "very exciting" because it helps him defray the costs of college. Christian says he does not have the time to handle a paid job along with his heavy course load and lab work. Theater major Justin Sumblin offered a similar message, noting that the OLLI scholarship helps him to pursue his dream of being an actor performing on Broadway. Other recipients shared similar thoughts. As they juggle research projects, leadership responsibilities and social work along with a busy course schedule, they have little time for a paid job to help offset educational expenses. They are all grateful for the OLLI awards.

OLLI President Glenn Kamber concluded that the day's events would not be possible without 24 years of close bonds between OLLI and George Mason. Whether it is teachers in the classroom, facility support, or scholarships for Mason students, "OLLI cannot be more grateful for the close synergies forged between us," he said.
