## Hello, Art! Looking Good-or at Least Interesting

Understanding modern art can be a challenge, but for those who took Susan Rudy's three-week class on Art since the 1950s at the National Gallery—well, we have a better appreciation of it, although understanding can still be a challenge.

Susan has been a docent at the National Gallery of Art for 18 years, since retiring from the CIA. She is trained to give guided tours in all the galleries in the museum (e.g., French Impressionists, Renaissance, American, Modern) and has shared her love of art and her expertise with OLLI members in other art courses.

During the course, Susan introduced modern art from the 1960s to the present, including artists such as Pollock, Caldwell, Rothko, Warhol, and others. Types of art discussed included abstraction, optical, and kinetic, with examples to illustrate the artists' intent. She identified key attributes in contemporary works, illustrated treatments of traditional themes, and indicated unconventional materials and techniques used. "This was a wonderful way for me to begin to get a grasp on modern art, a subject that has simply baffled me," said one attendee.
