George Mason University informed OLLI this week that much-needed renovations to the Tallwood parking lot have been postponed. As a result, the Tallwood facility will remain open this fall and beyond, depending on when the work can be rescheduled—likely Summer 2016. As you may have heard, Mason has agreed to pay for regrading and repaving the Tallwood parking lot, which has been streaming water into TA1 for years. The sandbags around the building are not remnants of war, but an effort to divert the tidal surge from Roberts Road during rainstorms.
