OLLI Town Hall Meeting

The OLLI Town Hall was held on November 4th at Tallwood; a small but enthusiastic group of members attended the meeting. The Town Hall took a traditional format with microphones available for audience members to share ideas. Although originally scheduled for one hour, the event was extended for an extra 30 minutes so that all members who desired an opportunity to air concerns would have a chance to speak.

OLLI President Ray Beery and OLLI Executive Director Jennifer Disano provided some question prompts to encourage open discourse. Many members submitted questions in writing, and many others voiced their concerns in person. Much of the member-driven discussion was oriented around growth plans and expectations, budget dissemination and circulation to membership, consideration of alternate dues structures, improved communication with members, and a need for aggressive strategic planning. Members also submitted input via the member survey, the link to which can be accessed on line at olli.gmu.edu through December 19.

Jennifer Disano presented a summary of activity from 2016, including a report on current membership numbers (1,247) and major accomplishments for 2016, including 25th anniversary events and programming, renovation of the Tallwood parking lot, the staff move to the cottage, and the creation of the 25th anniversary book on the history of OLLI. The event was recorded by OLLI Board Secretary Rita Way, and many board members were in attendance to give responses to questions. Input from the meeting will be summarized along with survey results and reported to the board for their understanding.
