OLLI Members Lay Wreaths at Quantico

It was a clear, sunny, and brisk day on Saturday, December 16, when eight OLLI members bundled up and joined a multitude of others at Quantico National Cemetery to lay wreaths on veterans' graves. The OLLI effort was organized by Martha Powers, OLLI Board member (pictured on the right).

"I saw people laying wreaths on veterans' graves two years ago when I visited my parents' grave," said Martha. "This year, I thought it would be a wonderful project for OLLI members to join *Wreaths Across America* to help sponsor wreaths for gravesites at Quantico."

Martha said her goal was 100 wreaths, but she underestimated the interest and generosity of OLLI members whose efforts provided 225 wreaths to the national project for Quantico. "This was such a wonderful way to pay tribute to our veterans," she said.



Wreaths Across America began in 1992 when the Worcester Wreath Company in Harrington, Maine, transported their surplus holiday wreaths to Arlington National Cemetery for placement on gravesites in a not-often-visited area. Since then, the effort has dramatically expanded and now provides donated wreaths in all states. This year, with 1,422 participating locations nationwide, nearly 500 trucks transported 1,565,000 veterans' remembrance wreaths throughout the country. Wreaths were placed on more than half of the 35,000 Quantico gravesites. The goal is 100 percent coverage.

Will she repeat the project next year? "Absolutely!" Martha said. "Many OLLI members have indicated they would like to participate next year with contributions and in person to lay the wreaths. It's a great way for OLLI members and others in our community to honor and respect those who have served our country."
