Deep thick chords
Augmented seventh arpeggios
Staccato releases
Alternating hands taking turns.

Key and meter changes Legato versus staccato Soft against loud Quirky chords expressing tension.

Soft arpeggio passage getting louder, louder, and LOUDER until both hands in unison arrive at the recapitulation.

The theme returns, but with counterpoint, hands echoing each other to a furious coda.

A meter change to 3/8 where left hand dominates.

Many diminished seventh chords fill one's ears.

Finally ending in 2/4 time in double forte, Two inversions of the D Major Chord Tonic form held firmly at the end For ear's final relief.
