The Internet of Things presented by Gary Arlen—Industry Analyst

The Internet of Things (IoT), depending on whom you believe, will be an industry generating \$300 billion (Gartner) or \$7.1 trillion (International Data

As devices—from connected wearables to smart-home products—expand their presence worldwide, the opportunities in IoT loom large. Interconnectedness is at the core of IoT, raising important questions about how well companies can play together to exploit the promise of this emerging business. The evolving IoT ecosystem encompasses consumer electronics, computing, telecommunications (wired and wireless) plus countless variables, including human interfaces and market acceptance.

For more than 30 years, Gary has conducted extensive research on business development and customer acceptance of new media/telecom technologies.
