OLLI Celebrates 25th Anniversary in Grand Style

OLLI rolled out the red carpet for its VIP 25th anniversary celebration at the Country Club of Fairfax October 14. Policymakers, founding members, and Mason directors all paid homage to a quarter-century of OLLI Mason excellence in inspiring the hearts, minds, and souls of active and intellectually curious older adults.

Mason Provost David Wu hailed OLLI as a "gift" to the community, a key part of the university's strategic plan to extend its learning mission into the neighborhoods of Northern Virginia. OLLI's success over 25 years mirrors that of George Mason, he said; in many ways, "we grew up together."



Provost Wu joined OLLI officials and university representatives in presenting the 25th OLLI Anniversary Gift to the Office of Military Services. Government officials heaped praise on OLLI programming and the extraordinary dedication of the membership to lifelong learning and volunteerism. U.S. Congressman Gerry Connolly quipped that when he decides to "hang it up" he too will join OLLI.
