With the implementation of Zoom technology, OLLI Mason members have enjoyed continuing participation on our program, social engagement and volunteer opportunities during the pandemic.

The greatest challenge in 2020 was our response to the Covid-19 pandemic. The institute pivoted all course offerings, social events and operational meetings to a virtual space. We increased staffing hours to support a much more labor-intensive product delivery increasing expenses. Additionally, membership dipped and we lost income. In response, we instituted a promotional rate, conducted a massive outreach campaign and applied for a PPP loan from the government. The CARES funds and the promotional campaign have bolstered us, for now, but we project huge losses in 2021.
